Subject: Correction to the Dialing Plan for NPAs 445 and 835 (Pennsylvania)

In PL-237 and in PL-267, which describe the introduction of overlay NPAs 445 and 835, the dialing plan was incorrectly stated.

Coincident with the activation of the new 445 and 835 NPAs, the dialing plan will be as follows:

- All local and toll calls within and between NPAs 445, 215, 267, 835, 610 and 484 may be dialed as 10-digits (NPA+NXX+XXXX) or, permissively, as 1+10 digits.
- All local and toll calls originating in NPAs 445, 215, 267, 835, 610 and 484 and terminating in other NPAs must be dialed as 1+10 digits (1+NPA+NXX+XXXX).
- Operator assisted, third party, and credit card calls must be dialed as 0 + 10 digits (0+NPA+NXX+XXXX).

In PL-267 dated March 20, 2001, NANPA informed the industry that the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission issued Order P00961071F002 on March 8, 2001 deferring the activation of the 445 and 85 overlay NPAs. The Commission believes the new overlay NPAs should not be activated until three months to NXX code exhaust in the existing NPAs (215/267 and 610/484). The Commission will inform all telecommunications carriers when either the 267 NPA or the 484 NPA is three months away from exhaust.
