Subject: New York 212/646, 718/347 and 917 Mandatory 10D Dialing

Implementation

In 1999 NANPA issued planning letters PL-175 and PL-185 for the implementation of the 212/646 and 718/347 overlays in New York City. Regulatory and legal issues affecting the dialing plan were still pending and the requirement for 10-digit dialing was postponed indefinitely.

In response to a joint petition for a temporary waiver of the Second Circuit's 10-month implementation plan for 10-digit dialing in New York City, the FCC recently granted an additional 8 months for implementation. In accordance with industry consensus, permissive 7 digit, 10 digit or 1+10 digit dialing for home NPA calls will begin at 12:01 AM Eastern Time on April 1, 2002. The permissive dialing will end at 12:01 AM Eastern Time on February 1, 2003.

After the introduction of mandatory 10-digit dialing on February 1, 2003, the dialing plan for the 212/646, 718/347 and 917 NPAs in New York City will be as follows:

- All home NPA calls must be dialed as 1+10 digits (1+HNPA+NXX+XXXX) or, permissively, as 10 digits (HNPA+NXX+XXXX).
- All foreign NPA calls must be dialed as 1+10 digits (1+FNPA+NXX+XXX).
- All operator assisted calls, including credit card, collect, and third party calls will require the prefix "0" plus 10-digits (0+NPA+NXX+XXXX).

Starting with mandatory dialing and continuing at least through March 31, 2004, the NY PSC staff recommends all carriers provide an informative announcement for all 7 digit calls informing the caller they must dial 1+10 digits to complete their call.

The information in this planning letter reflects detailed information about NPA relief activities. The information has been derived from commission orders and from industry implementation consensus decisions. The implementation of the plan described in this letter is the responsibility of individual service providers, and NANPA does not guarantee that the activities and plans will occur exactly as described herein.
