Subject: 689 NPA Implementation Suspended (Central Florida)

On March 25, 2002, the Florida Public Service Commission issued Order No. PSC-02-10405-FOF-TL in Docket No. 010743-TL specifying an overlay as the relief method for the 407/321 NPA with implementation July 15, 2002. The 407/321 NPA currently serves Orange, Osceola, Seminole and parts of Lake and Volusia Counties in Central Florida. The portion of the 321 NPA serving Brevard County will remain unchanged.

Subsequently, the Commission in Order No. PSC-02-0743-FOF-TL dated May 31, 2002, suspended implementation of the 689 NPA. The Commission directed the telecommunications industry, represented by NANPA, to provide notice when there is an estimated one-year supply of assignable central office codes (NXX codes) available.

The information in this planning letter reflects detailed information about NPA relief activities. The information has been derived from state commission orders and from industry implementation consensus decisions. The implementation of the plan described in this letter is the responsibility of individual service providers, and NANPA does not guarantee that the activities and plans will occur exactly as described herein.
